

Van Cornish Scholarship Program

A student may receive the scholarship award only one time. Applicants who do not receive a scholarship are encouraged to apply in subsequent years.

Who is eligible

Each applicant must be accepted to or attending an accredited post-secondary educational institution. The applicant must have completed their senior year of high school. The applicant must have shown livestock or have participated in racing horses at the Dayton Fair.

How to apply

The student must complete an application and answer three provided questions. Each applicant must be subject to a personal interview by the committee of the scholarship program if needed.

Applications must be postmarked by July 15th to be considered.

Announcement of awards

Applicants will be notified by mail and the names of the successful applicants will be announced at a livestock event and at the harness racing. Recipients must be present or represented to receive the scholarship. A minimum of two scholarships will be awarded.
